


The Midtown Action Council (MAC) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to sustain and improve the physical, social, civic, cultural, environmental, and economic welfare of the citizens, properties, and business of the historic midtown neighborhood in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

MAC was founded on November 14, 1977 and is the oldest continuously-operated neighborhood organization in the City of Harrisburg.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

For nearly 45 years, MAC has collaborated with neighbors and organizations within the greater Midtown neighborhood and throughout the City to continue a proud history of mutual respect, community purpose, civic action, and goodwill.

As I prepare to round out my second year serving as MAC's President, I remain ever impressed by the passion of our neighborhood in the face of the pandemic. Midtown - and historic Midtown in particular - has seen outstanding growth. Home sales are through the roof and we are seeing businesses open and develop along the Third Street corridor. Just outside of our boundaries, we are watching the construction of the New Federal Courthouse and State Archives. Change is not coming, it is here.

MAC has grown with the neighborhood. We have welcomed Board members who are new to the neighborhood. We created a committee dedicated to keeping an eye on City Council, Zoning, and other matters within City governance that may impact our lives. We have also taken dedicated steps to partner with the City on efforts in our neighborhood, including increased lighting and hosting informational sessions with developers so our neighborhood is involved in decisions that impact us.

We also took on the role of co-hosting debates for one of the most hotly-contested elections in Harrisburg's recent history. Working with Friends of Midtown and Young Professionals of Color, we ensured

that debates for the School Board, City Council, and Mayoral Election were fair and made available virtually to all.

Of course, we continue our beautification efforts that include neighborhood clean-ups and the holiday decorating contest. We are excited to have reintroduced the holiday bows - a collaboration with MAC and the City that saw bows installed on light poles throughout historic Midtown. Most important remains our partnership with the Historic Harrisburg Association. HHA has remained our physical home and meeting place, as well as home in the emotional sense where resources can be shared and efforts supported.

As we enter 2022, we look forward to another great year of community service and project work while celebrating our 45th anniversary. If you have thought about getting involved in the past, now is the time! We want you to be a part of this ever-evolving organization and we hope to see you at an upcoming meeting!





This year, MAC partnered with Friends of Midtown (FOM) and the Historic Harrisburg Association (HHA) to host two-day Virtual Town Hall events focused on development projects within the greater Midtown neighborhood on two separate occasions. 2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

First Quarter (January - March)

- **Annual Meeting** - MAC holds its 2021 Annual Meeting virtually with Special Guest, Myrtle McDuff
- **Midtown Development Town Halls** - MAC Co-Hosts the first of two Virtual Town Halls surrounding development projects in Midtown
- **Strategic Planning** - MAC launches a strategic planning initiative

Second Quarter (April - June)

- **Candidate Debates Series** - MAC Co-Hosts a virtual candidate debate series ahead of the Primary election
- **Verbeke Median Cleanup** - MAC volunteers collect trash and pull weeds from the Verbeke Street Median
- **Midtown Yard Sale** - MAC plans and promotes the annual Midtown Yard Sale

Third Quarter (July - September)

- **Facebook Group Page** - MAC creates a new Facebook Group Page to improve its communication and outreach to the neighborhood
- **Historic Marker Updates** - MAC used grant funding to update and install two historic marker exhibits (Kunkel Building and The Civic Club of Harrisburg)

IN MEMORIAM

John C. Bircher, III

November 20, 1944 - August 16, 2021

The Historic Midtown Neighborhood lost a life-long resident and one of its greatest advocates this year. John Bircher, who proudly served on the MAC Board of Directors for many years, was the true definition of a "good neighbor" and exemplified what makes Historic Midtown such a wonderful place to live. Always willing to lend a hand or provide exactly the right tool to perform the specific task at hand, John went out of his way to help his friends and neighbors.



While serving on the MAC Board of Directors, John was a master at finding solutions and workarounds to make lasting improvements to our neighborhood despite limited resources. For example, he was instrumental to the success of the Graffiti Removal Task Force by loaning his personal power washing equipment and technical expertise.

Our neighborhood is stronger today thanks to his dedication, generosity, and kindness given each day of his life. Although he will be missed greatly, our memories of John Bircher will always be remembered by MAC and the Historic Midtown Neighbors.
